<p>15 FEB SUNDAY</p>	<p>8:30 AM 9:00AM</p>	<p>Breakfast at Hotel</p> <p>Depart for Full Day Cape Peninsula Tour</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scenic Drive via Chapman's Peak Drive <i>Chapman's Peak Drive winds its way between Noordhoek and Hout Bay on the Atlantic Coast on the south-western tip of South Africa. Chapman's Peak Drive is one of the most spectacular marine drives in the world. The 9km route, with its 114 curves, skirts the rocky coastline of Chapman's Peak (593m). Chapman's Peak Drive is affectionately known as "Chappies" and is a must for anyone who is passionate about the majestic Cape Town scenery, with sheer drops to the sea below and towering mountains rising above you. The twists and curves in the road seem endless and it is a photographers dream. It is a paradise for motorists, sightseers, picnickers, runners, hikers and bikers. The drive offers stunning 180° views with many areas along the route where you can stop and take in the exquisite scenery or sit down for a relaxing picnic.</i>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hout Bay Village and Overlook <i>Hout Bay was formerly a fishing village and has managed to maintain its unique combination of fishing harbour and country atmosphere, despite development. Its long, sandy beach faces a bay framed by mountains and is quite simply exceptionally beautiful. Capetonians throng here over weekends to partake of the local fish & chips and to catch a glimpse of the resident Cape seals that make the harbour their home.</i> • Cape Point and Lighthouse Trek <i>At the tip of the Cape Peninsula 60 km south-west of Cape Town, lies Cape Point, a nature reserve within the Table Mountain National Park; a declared Natural World Heritage Site. Encompassing 7 750 hectares of rich and varied flora and fauna; abounding with buck, baboons and Cape Mountain Zebra as well as over 250 species of birds, Cape Point is a nature enthusiast paradise. Even though it has long since been decommissioned, the old Cape Point lighthouse is an important icon of the Cape Peninsula, and captures the imaginations of visitors who ascend to this craggy spot and look down at the rocky coastline and the ocean. We'll ride the "flying dutchman" funicular to arrive at the top of Cape Point itself.</i> • Cape of Good Hope <i>When following the western side of the African coastline from the equator, however, the Cape of Good Hope marks the point where a ship begins to travel more eastward than southward. Thus, the first modern rounding of the cape in 1488 by Portuguese explorer Bartolomeu Dias was a milestone in the attempts by the Portuguese to establish direct trade relations with the Far East.</i> <p>12:30PM Lunch Near the Sea at Seaforth Restaurant in Simons Town <i>Set on the white sands of Seaforth Beach in Simon's Town, with stunning views of mountains and sea, and penguins to entertain you, Seaforth Restaurant is a spectacular venue on the water's edge. Seaforth offers you the opportunity to delight in the fruits of the sea, or a range of platters fit for the most discerning palate.</i></p> <p>2:00PM Boulders Beach Penguin Experience <i>Boulders is a popular beach near Simon's Town, Cape Town in the Western Cape province of South Africa. There are larger and more scenic beaches around, as Boulders, which gets its name from the large boulders surrounding it, is fairly small, although it is often sheltered from the prevailing winds. From the beach one has views over False Bay. It is world famous for its colony of African penguins.</i></p> <p>3:30PM Table Mountain Visit via Cable Car <i>Since the first person laid eyes on Table Mountain, it has exerted its powerful and charismatic pull, enchanting and drawing any and all who fall under its spell. The way to the top had never been easy, and for many centuries only a handful of bold and enterprising people could say that they had climbed it. In 1929 the original cableway opened allowing easy access to the top of the mountain. Since its opening, over 16 million people have taken the trip to the top of Table Mountain. The Table Mountain cableway has since become something of a landmark in Cape Town, and has carried some of Cape Town's most illustrious visitors including King George VI and Queen Elizabeth II, as well as Oprah Winfrey, Sting, Stefi Graf, Arnold Schwarzenegger and Magaret Thatcher.</i></p> <p>5:30PM Return to Hotel</p>

For any intrepid tourist or appreciator of nature's wonders, Hermanus is the ideal location for an unforgettable experience.</i></p> <p>12:00PM</p> <p>Lunch in Hermanus - TBD</p> <p>1:30PM</p> <p>Quad Biking in Hermanus through the Vineyards <i>Quad bike through the world-renowned vineyards of Hamilton Russell and Southern Right wineries. Travel up the mountain and through the fynbos kingdom. This route takes you into the Fernkloof Nature Reserve and your half way point is one of the most pristine look-out points in the Western Cape. From here you will have a spectacular birds-eye-view of Hermanus. Cameras on this trip are an absolute must! - Whale spotting from this vantage point allows you to see the bigger picture of activity throughout the entire bay.</i></p> <p>3:30PM</p> <p>Continue to Gansbaai <i>Gansbaai is named the BIG-2-TOWN after the numerous Great white sharks that cruise in the waters east of Danger Point Peninsula and the many Southern Right Whales that hang out around the shores on the western side of the Danger Point Peninsula between July and December.</i></p> <p>4:15PM</p> <p>Check into The Roundhouse</p>

	<p>4:00PM</p> <p>6:30PM</p> <p>7:30PM</p>	<p>Drive to St Lucia and iSimangaliso Wetlands <i>The iSimangaliso Wetland Park was listed as South Africa’s first World Heritage Site in December 1999 in recognition of its superlative natural beauty and unique global values. The 332 000 hectare Park contains three major lake systems, eight interlinking ecosystems, 700 year old fishing traditions, most of South Africa’s remaining swamp forests, Africa’s largest estuarine system, 526 bird species and 25 000 year-old coastal dunes - among the highest in the world. The name iSimangaliso means miracle and wonder, which aptly describes this unique place.</i></p> <p>Arrive in St Lucia</p> <p>Dinner at Umlilo Lodge - Authentic South African Braai <i>Umlilo Lodge is located in St Lucia and surrounded by the Big 4 (no Lions) iSimangaliso Wetland Park; South Africa's first National World Heritage Site.</i></p> <p>Overnight at Umlilo Lodge</p>

With their eco-friendly quiet and smoke free motors, you will get so close to the Hippos and Crocodiles, that you can almost touch them. These tours also concentrate on the many bird species at the Estuary. Common sights are Fish Eagles, Kingfishers, Herons and many other species.</i></p> <p>Cultural Tour to Khula Township <i>South African townships have come to be defined as residential areas reserved for non-whites living near, or working in, white-only communities during the Apartheid regime. Although South Africa’s system of racial segregation was abolished during the early 1990’s, it takes generations for a population to naturally shift and rebalance after such forced separation. Although townships are no longer reserved for non-whites, they remain a fascinating opportunity to glimpse not only the historical effects of Apartheid, but also into the current socio-economic impacts on modern society. For most foreign travelers, visiting a township is the ultimate example of leaving your comfort zone. Remember that you are going into an area that people live in and this is not a “typical tourist destination”.</i></p> <p>Traditional Zulu Lunch in the Township</p> <p>Afternoon Horse Back Riding on the Beach <i>Experience the bush by horse back into parts of the iSimangaliso park and along the beach for approx 2 ½ hrs</i></p>
